



Every society that values social justice and as anxious to improve the lot of the common man and cultivate all available talent must ensure progressive equality of opportunity to all sections of the population. This is the only guaranty for the building up of human society in which the exploitation of the weak will be minimized.

Beneficiary groups of the positive discrimination and reservation system are different criteria i.e. Cast, Religion, Status of Domicile Some reservations are also made for Single Girl Child, Sons/ Daughters/grandsons/granddaughters of Freedom Fighters, Physically handicapped, Sports personalities sponsored by various organizations.

With few exceptions, all jobs under certain State governments are reserved for those who are domiciled within the jurisdiction of that government. For example, in Punjab Engineering College (Chandigarh) 85 per cent of seats were earlier reserved for Chandigarh domiciles – now it is 5 per cent. There are also some seats reserved for the Jammu and Kashmir ‘migrant’ in every Government-aided educational institute.
